
Litres and Millilitres

A litre (L) and a millilitre (ml) are two units for measuring capacity.

This bottle holds 1 litre of water.

A millilitre is about 4 drops of water.





Mr. Franklin filled a bucket with water to clean his floor. Does his bucket probably hold 9 litres or 9 millilitres of water?

A baker adds half of a teaspoon of vanilla to her cake recipe. Did she use 2 litres or 2 millilitres of vanilla?

Chris bought a cup of hot chocolate. Does his cup probably hold 400 litres or 400 millilitres of hot chocolate?

Kate bought juice for her friends to drink at her birthday party. Did she probably buy 5 litres of juice or 5 millilitres?

Tom has a large fish tank at home. Does his fish tank hold 100 litres or 100 millilitres?

Peter filled the bath with water to wash himself. Does the bath probably hold 150 litres or 150 millilitres of water?
