


























Shapes (2 players)

- Roll the dice and say the number.
- Choose a shape with the same number of sides as the number on the dice.
- Put one of your bottle caps on it.
- The first one that gets three of their bottle caps in a line wins.
- If you roll a 1 or a 2, roll again.
- If there is nowhere you can put your counter, roll again.
- You may do the template of the board game below using marker and reused paper.

- 2 coloured bottle caps

Number bonds

Resources

- Reused paper
- Marker
- Bottle caps
- 2 dice (optional)

- Draw the number bonds chart below on a paper.
- Draw numbered circles (1 to 10) on a cardboard.
- Ask the children to choose a numbered circle and place in the provided space on the board game.
- Together use bottle caps to find different ways of making up the chosen number.
- You can also use a dice (or two dice) to choose the number. (Add/subtract the number of dots on the two dice and choose the answer from the numbered circles).
